Visit the website or contact the Foundation for a copy of its annual report containing guidelines, restrictions, procedures and a list of information to be included in a complete proposal. The board meets in March, July and November to consider requests.

Restrictions:

No grants for: organizations primarily supported by tax-derived funds; conduit organizations; start-up funding; organizations with two consecutive years of operating losses; primary and secondary schools and the ancillary programs and projects of those schools; individuals; endowments; research projects; production of films or other media-related projects; historic renovation; churches or church projects; museums or museum projects; animal or animal-related projects; preschools, day-care centers, extended care facilities, or respite care facilities; deficit funding or retirement of debt; special events or meetings; purchase of computer equipment; national health organizations.
