How to Apply: Organizations seeking support from the Foundation should send a Letter of Inquiry describing the organization that wishes to submit a proposal and the capital project for which funding is being requested. If the Foundation determines the project is within its current scope of giving, a full proposal will be requested.

Restrictions: The Boettcher Foundation does NOT accept proposals or provide grants for: individuals; out-of-state projects; operations; gymnasiums/athletic fields; housing; purchase of tables or tickets for dinners/events; large urban hospitals; media presentations; small business start-ups; open space/parks; conferences/seminars/workshops; organizations that primarily serve animals; debt reduction; pilot programs; endowments; religious groups or organizations for their religious purposes; scholarships; travel; historic preservation.
