How to Apply: Applications for Home Emergency Assistance Grants are emailed to interested agencies on June 30 and must be returned by July 31. Applications must be completed online and hard copy of attachments forwarded to EOC by the deadline date. Faxed copies are not accepted. Only the required information should be sent and only required questions answered; other documents will not be considered. Applications for Long Term Energy Solutions Grants are emailed to interested agencies on June 2 and must be returned by August 1. Applications must be completed online and hard copy of attachments forwarded to EOC by the deadline date. Fax copies are not accepted. Only the required information should be sent and only required questions answered; other documents will not be considered. Energy savings calculations are required.

Restrictions: Agencies applying for home energy assistance grants must provide direct services to income-limited clients and effectively respond to emergency needs in a specific geographic area within Colorado. Long term energy solutions grant applicants must provide conservation, energy efficiency and education to income-limited Coloradans. All agencies must have a non-discrimination policy and must be fiscally sound. EOC does not fund individuals directly or pay for agency utility bills.
