Applications and guidelines are updated frequently, and current versions are available on the website. Free application workshops are held every January and July. Free application assistance, including draft application review is available.

Restrictions:

Grants are made only to public entities and nonprofit organizations. Private individuals and for-profit businesses may participate by finding an eligible applicant willing to act as a fiscal agent. Grants in excess of \$300,000 are rare. SHF may require future restrictions, such as covenants or easements, on properties receiving grants for physical work. Procurement requirements (bids, RFPs, etc.) may be required. A minimum cash match of 25% of the total project cost is required, although this requirement is waivable with justification. If the subject property is owned by a private individual or for-profit business, not less than 50% cash match is expected. Grants for physical work can only be made to designated properties. Applicants must prove that their project will benefit the public. Ability to leverage matching funds is critical.

Funds are obtained from tax revenues from legalized gaming in Central City, Black Hawk, and Cripple Creek and are administered by the State Historical Fund, a program of the Colorado Historical Society.

Applications are available by calling the contact information listed above, and will be sent to you. SHF Program guidelines are available on the website.

Restrictions:

Grants are made only to public entities and nonprofit organizations. Private individuals and for-profit businesses may participate by finding an eligible applicant willing to act as a fiscal agent. Emergency grants are intended for immediate stabilization measures, and will rarely exceed \$10,000. A minimum cash match of 25% of the total project cost is recommended but not required. If the subject property is owned or occupied by a private individual or for-profit business, a cash match of not less than 50% is expected. Applicants must prove that their project will benefit the public.

Funds are obtained from tax revenues from legalized gaming in Central City, Black Hawk, and Cripple Creek and are administered by the State Historical Fund, a program of the Colorado Historical Society.

The historic Structure Assessment must be prepared by an architect or a structural engineer working under the direct guidance of an architect. These grants are available for \$10,000 or less. If the applicant can justify the need to hire additional consultants such as engineers, archeologists, historic preservation consultants, contractors, historians or cost estimators an additional amount up to \$5,000 can be awarded at the discretion of the State Historical Fund.
