How to Apply: The Foundation only accepts full applications (no Letters of Intent). Please visit the website or call

a program officer for more information. The Foundation encourages phone calls and staff would be happy to talk with you at anytime during the grantmaking process. (If you have never applied to the Foundation before, staff strongly encourages you to contact the office before completing an application.)

Restrictions: The Foundation will only award grants to public charities that are tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the IRS Code and "not a private foundation" under section 509(a) of the Code. Applications from government entities and school districts will also be considered. Grants will not be awarded: to individuals; for past operating deficits or debt retirement; for endowments; for testimonial dinners or events. Only one grant application will be accepted per 12-month period.

Additional Information: The Foundation's funding priority is on programs that support the education and development of children ages zero to five (this includes early childhood and preschool programs, home visitation, professional development and education for service providers, parent and child interaction, parenting education, language development/early literacy, and behavior and social competence in classroom situations). The Foundation will consider requests for older children for constructive activities during non-school hours if the program is located in a rural community. The Foundation will also consider requests for teen pregnancy prevention programs. The Common Grant Application is accepted with modifications.
